**This month's question:
 Are you driving your husband to adultery?**

It is estimated there are about two million men who commit adultery every year. I feel this number would be greatly reduced if wives took an inventory of themselves and asked: "Have I contributed in any way to my husband's infidelity?" There are wives who give themselves too completely to home and children and deny their husbands companionship and love.

Hard work and faithfulness to the marriage vows are not enough to hold the couple together. Hurried and routine sex relations are often to blame for infidelities that need never have happened.

James L. Collier, author of an article entitled "Are You Driving Your Husband to Adultery?" (Pageant, Jan. 1964) writes:

"It is in this area—the area of sex—that the husband often first senses he's not really wanted. Perhaps more men have been driven into adultery because of their wives' indifference than for any other cause."

Collier cites the story of Frank and Anna Brown: "The Browns lived on the West Coast where Frank worked as a computer technician in the office of a large factory. They had married young, Anna when she was only 17.

Naive, immature, and inexperienced, Anna had been raised by her strict family to believe that sex was wrong. The trouble was inevitable. Four years after their marriage Frank ran into a former girlfriend with whom he had had sexual intercourse before he had met Anna. A drink together for old times' sake led Frank to complain: "My wife hates sex."

Their affair lasted two months before the girlfriend began badgering Frank to divorce his wife and marry her. Upset and confused, Frank finally confessed his indiscretion to his wife and begged forgiveness.

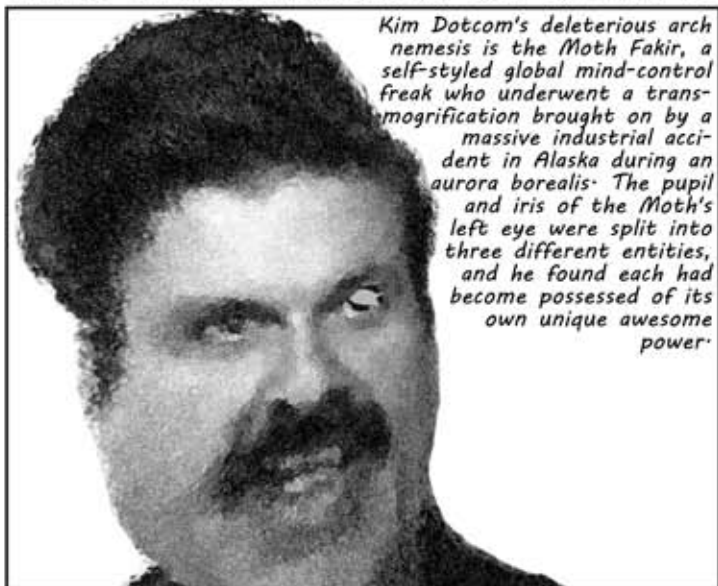
Hurt and bewildered, Anna did what thousands of women have done in similar circumstances: she ran to lawyer.

The marriage counselor to whom her lawyer sent her got the true story by asking: "Do you enjoy having sexual intercourse with your husband?"

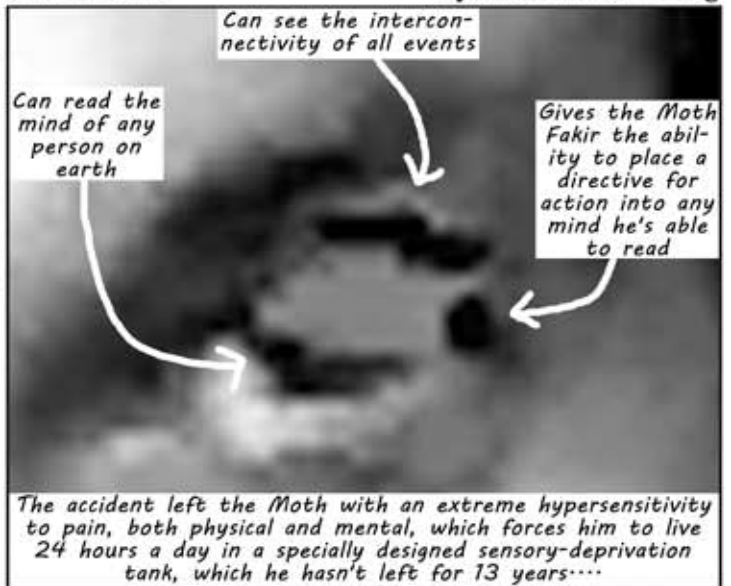
