Except when we do maybe a six-month anniversary or a year anniversary you might see like a dollar increase because I use a lot of ingredients in something like that. But I try to stay comparable. Even our glassware is comparable; it's \$3.50 for an empty 64-ounce bottle and \$2.50 for an empty 32-ounce bottle. Joe and I traveled last summer all across New York State to all the breweries, and we hated going to a brewery that would charge like \$14.00 for their glass growlfor treasure in any low foliage areas near your ers. We hated that. So we wanted to keep it reasonable for everybody.

What are your plans for the future? Where do you see this going?

We're already looking to upgrade to a three-barrel or five-barrel system by the end of summer because the reception we've gotten has been so overwhelming from the community. And then we plan on bottling our beer because I've been approached by several distributing companies to have us bottle our beer so we can put it in Wegman's and stores around the area. But definitely in the near future more beer, more beer for people. A lot more.
