The Tiger Cats are now eligible to compete for the WSFL 8's National Championship that will take place June 29th in Memphis, TN. Good luck, Tiger Cats!



The cartoon at left, directed by Warner Bros. genius Bob Clampett, was ranked 45th on The 50 Greatest Cartoons list edited by Jerry Beck. Another Clampett cartoon, "Coal Black and de Sebben Dwarfs" (right), is ranked 21st on the list and is either the most outrageous piece of racism ever committed to an animation cell or it is a hilarious and sexy masterpiece that all races can (and do) enjoy, depending on how you look at it. "Coal Black" is one of the socalled "Censored Eleven," a group of Warner Bros. cartoons that the company self-banned from syndication or any showings in the 1960s due to their content, and they haven't been seen-officially-since. But recently, Warner Bros. has decided the time is right and will be releasing all of the Censored Eleven on a special DVD. No release date has been given as yet. So for now, "That's all, folks!"
